

Top 3 Flashpoints

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1 - Iran Nuclear Weapons Development IRAN Has Crossed EVERY RED LINE....

- Open Source Intel believes that Iran successfully tested its latest nuclear device in North Korea in February 12, 2013. The joint Iran-NK development program is code-named "Green Chariot" & started in 2008
- A second program, code-named "Silk Cocoon," expands the first program by developing intercontinental ballistic missiles with technological help from NK and China.
- Iran is estimated to be months away from possessing a workable nuclear device that is small enough to be placed in a ship and detonated off the coast of Israel
- Iran is 10-12 months away from being able to launch a nuclear warhead by their largest rocket the Shahab 3, but their target date for matching warhead and missile capability is reported to be January 2014.

Once Iran has a viable nuclear arsenal, with 4-10 warheads deliverable by rocket, how will this affect the balance of power and the arms race in the Middle East?

What will Israel do?



"A month has passed since elections were held in Iran, and Iran continues to race toward the development of military nuclear capability..."They're building intercontinental ballistic missiles to reach the American mainland within a few years... They don't need these missiles to reach us. They already have missiles that can reach us. (Hence) our clocks are ticking at a different pace..." When will Iran have a nuclear capability?

- "THE resounding victory of Hassan Rohani, the most moderate and outward-looking of the presidential candidates deemed fit to contest the election by the supreme leader, Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, has raised hopes for a nuclear deal between Iran and the international community...but ... The die is already cast: nothing is likely to stop Iran getting the bomb if and when it decides it wants one... Yet the inconvenient truth is that while the talks seem destined to continue, Iran is close to what is known as "critical capability"—the point at which it could make a dash to produce enough weapons-grade uranium for one or more bombs before the IAEA or Western intelligence agencies would even know it had done so. - China, North Korea and Iran will all soon have nuclear missiles capable of reaching the U.S., according to a report published by the Pentagon Thursday, July 12, 2013. The report added that Iran will be ready to test an intercontinental ballistic missile (ICBM) with the capability to strike the U.S. by 2015. see: http://www.fas.org/programs/ssp/nukes/nuclearweapons/NASIC2013_050813.pdf

What is the US doing about this?

- Talking about reducing our Nuclear arsenal in the "Zero Option."
- **Remember what Ronald Reagan once said:** "Experience has taught us that preparedness deters aggression and that weakness invites it." Ronald Reagan 1988
- ANTAL'S OPINION: The US should make a clear statement that any nuclear attack on the USA or our Allies will result in immediate and overwhelming retaliation. No half measures. No bluff. Full response. Deterrence requires fear.

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2 - Egypt Unrest with the fall of political Islam (Muslim Brotherhood removed from power by Army Coup)

- Egyptians took to the streets to oppose Morsi's Islamization of politics. Army responded.
- Military Coup opposed by Iran, Turkey, Tunisia & radical Islamists
 -- Coup Supported by Saudi Arabia & UAE. USA tentative?
 Next 3 months - High Possibility of unrest, killings, terrorism &
- sabotage
 Next 6 Months Medium
 possibility of Civil War if Army
 does not bring about elections and
 if Brotherhood are supported by \$s
 & weapons from Iran, fighters
 from worldwide Jihadis & political
 support from Turkey.

QUESTIONs:

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Will Egypt devolve into civil war like Syria?

Will the Egyptian Military be able to maintain stability and set conditions for democratic elections?



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3 – Syrian Civil War

- Free Syrian Army and Radical Anti-Assad foreign Jihadis are fighting each other. Jihadis are extremely brutal, enforcing strict sharia law & turning the Syrian people away from the Rebel cause.
- Assad's government forces are on the offensive
- Possibility of larger war with Jordan and Israel as Hezbollah & Iranian Quds Forces strike rebels fleeing main battle areas

QUESTIONs:

Will Iran leverage the Syrian civil war to force Israeli intervention in Syria & therefore a larger Middle East war?

Will the USA do anything to try to stop the war and keep it from spreading?

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What are the risks to the USA concerning Egypt?

- Support the Egyptian military, which is the only source of stability of Egypt, there is a chance for stability and transition to democracy.
- If the US does not support the Egyptian military, then Egypt may devolve into a civil war and emerge as a fervent enemy of the USA, with the possibility of the unpredictability of traffic though the Suez Canal and the possibility of a greater war with Israel.
- If we half-heartedly support the military, the same occurs.
- If we support the Islamists, the same occurs.

Why is Egypt Important to the USA?

- Egypt has the largest population (84 million people) of any country in the Middle East. Iran is 2d with 76 million. As Egypt goes, so goes the Middle East.
- US Access to the strategically important Suez Canal both militarily and commercially. Price of oil will skyrocket if the strategically important Suez canal is closed
- US Access to Egyptian airspace.
- Preserving Egypt's peace treaty with Israel. For example, Egypt was crucial to ending the 2012 fighting between Israel and Hamas.
